Estee Chandler Bio:

I grew up in Los Angeles and spent most of my adult life working in the film industry, on both sides of the camera. Along with Nagwa Ibrahim, I currently host and produce the long running KPFK radio show, Middle East in Focus. I am also the producer and one of the host/reporters for the KPFK daily news report Middle East Minute+ which is a joint project with JVP.

My drive to do civic work took on a new urgency in 2001 after the US Supreme Court ruled that the state of Florida must stop counting the votes in their 2000 Presidential election. Oddly, the year I spent in 2007/2008 moving through the volunteer ranks of the Obama for America Campaign as a Deputy Field Organizer, helping to train hundreds of volunteers and being elected as a Delegate representing California's 28th Congressional at the 2008 Democratic Convention in Denver, CO; is what both gave me the experience I needed to organize a new Los Angeles chapter of JVP and before that, led to my education and enlightenment on Israel and Palestine.

In 2010 with a lot of help from Stefanie Fox, I launched the Los Angeles chapter of JVP and have continued to lead the chapter, now as a member of our diverse and creative coordinating committee.

Statement:

With lots of help from Stefanie Fox, I launched JVP-LA in 2010 and was happy to join the fundraising committee soon after. Ever since the US Supreme Court appointed a president in 2001, politics had become my favorite sport, so I was very happy to be asked to join JVP's Legislative Leadership Team following our 2013 NMM. With Los Angeles being more of a metropolis than a city; it seemed important to establish a strong network of aligned organizations, so early on we began coordinating with CAIR LA/OC, Friends of Sabeel LA/OC, AMP, Middle East Ministries and we joined US Campaign for Palestinian Rights (then US Campaign to End the Israeli Occupation.)

I considered running for the JVP Board carefully for a couple of years, but this year I felt like the Los Angeles chapter had grown strong enough to continue to thrive, and I could bring the same energy, experience and skills to the board that I had here locally.
